Course Grade: Your lowest score among the first four exams will be dropped. The remaining exam scores, which must include the final exam, will each constitute 25% of the total course grade. The letter grade is determined as follows: 90-100 = A, 87-89 = B+, 80-86 = B, 77-79 = C+, 70-76 = C, 67-69 = D+, 60-66 = D, 0-59 = F.

Homework Policy: Homework exercises are assigned for every section of the book that is covered, but they are not collected and therefore do not directly influence the course grade. However, to have any realistic prospect of succeeding in the course it is essential to do the exercises, since all of the exams are based upon them. Half of lecture time will be devoted to working out exercises that students have questions about.

Attendance Policy: Attendance is not mandatory, but it comes highly recommended. In my experience those who do not show up tend to wash out.

Withdrawal Policy: If you need to withdraw, be sure to make it official with the administration to avoid receiving an F on your transcript. The deadline is April 8, 2014.

If an exam is missed, it is given a score of zero and will be dropped unless it is the final exam, which cannot be dropped. Only one exam can be dropped.
